The NPNA Board met on February 13th at the home of NPNA President Susan Bennett.

Tony Prosser presented the monthly crime report. There were 57 incidences in our neighborhood but over 1000 in a one-mile radius of our neighborhood. Of those 57 incidences, 23% occurred between 10 PM and 8 AM and the vast majority of the remainder occurred during the daytime.

Chuck Maguire and Bill Gannon will make a presentation at the annual meeting on their drive to revitalize the Neighborhood Watch Program. Bill will bring two 24x36 posters that show the delineations of the block captain zones. Chuck will have information for those who want to be block captains. Laura Kuehn, the Head of Crime Prevention Programs for APD, has been invited to the annual meeting.

The remodeling of the house on Harold continues at a slow but steady pace. No date for the completion of the project is available at this time.

The Board thanks all the volunteers who took part in the annual bike trail cleanup project on February 2nd under the leadership of Susan and Jeff Hagemann.

The Board hopes that everyone is enjoying the new bench in Netherwood Park. An official ribbon-cutting ceremony will be held when the weather gets warmer.

The first 2019 Food Truck Wednesday has been tentatively set for April 10th.

Are speed bumps needed for the streets that border Netherwood Park? The Board held a brief discussion on this subject and decided to continue to monitor reports of disturbing the peace from speeding or any other cause.

The Board requests that neighbors respond and report what they see. Pathways to report include:

- *Go to NPNA website and follow CRIME tab
- *Go to APD website directly and file a crime report
- *Go to APD APP to file crime report and other options such as crime mapping
- *CALL 242-COPS or 911 and report your crime.
- *Do not confront criminals or take action into your own hands. Know your neighbors and keep in touch with your block captains. Block captains can provide summaries to the Board.
