Crime Report

In the first week of November at 5:00AM on 2516 Cutler Court an unknown woman who seemed drunk tried to force herself into the house.

On the night of November 19 a car parked on Schell near Morrow was vandalized. A window was broken out and sunglasses stolen.

In December robbers broke down the door, forced themselves into a house on Ada Place and took many valuable items including a television. There was a house alarm.

Forced entry and burglaries were reported close to 1800 Bryn Mawr, 1700 Notre Dame, 1800 Newton Place, 1700 Richmond, 1800 Vassar 1600 Princeton and 2400 Cutler.

Sgt. Barrera of APD placed two undercover vehicles in the area on Jan. 9 and 10 because of the rash of break-ins in the neighborhood. The system seems to be that someone is watching homes and within 10 or 15 minutes of observing that the owner has just left the home, the robbers ring the door bell, if no answer they break in through a rear window or door...maybe sometimes the front door.

If family members are home (especially children) and someone knocks at the door, make sure that they answer....this will deter robbers from assuming no one is there and breaking in.
