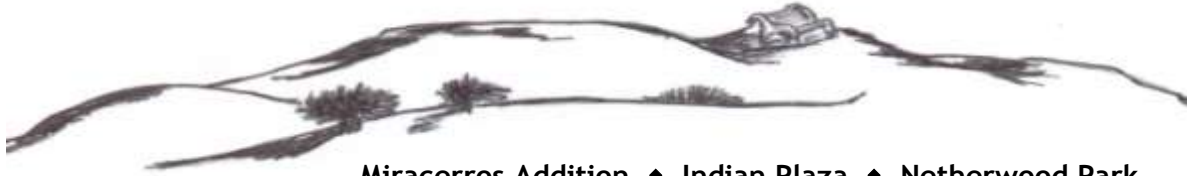

Netherwood Yesterdays – John Vittal, NPNA Board Member- 266-0882

The years from 1938 to 1949 featured two mileposts in the history of our neighborhood. The Bernalillo County Commissioners met on April 23, 1940 and changed all the street names. The next day streets were named after colleges and universities to extend the pattern first established many years before by D.K.B. Sellers. East 21st Street becomes Girard Avenue to honor a leading Albuquerque merchant in the 1880's. East 30th Street became Carlisle Boulevard. There is no record of how many people were confused by all these changes and how many new road maps were sold. The University of New Mexico Golf Course (now known as the North Course) opened in 1942 as a championship course with eighteen tough holes. The course hosted 1948 Albuquerque Open won by 1947 Masters' champion Jimmy Demaret.
